Book Fairs

Internet Safety: This week we celebrated **Internet Safety Day**. The theme for this year was 'All fun and games? Exploring respect and relationships online'. Between chatting and gaming online, scrolling through social media, and streaming music and video, young people are almost constantly connected to the digital world in their free time. Now more so than ever: recent research identified that 77% of youngsters were spending more time online on games and apps than they did before the pandemic. In school this week, the children learnt about their role in creating a safer internet and how they can shape the interactive spaces they are a part of. So, to tie in with this, we have included a Parents Guide that gives us ways in which we can all contribute to more respectful and positive relationships with people online.

Longfield Avenue: A reminder that you should only park in Longfield Avenue if you have the correct permit to do so. This road has resident permit bays and Waltham Forest will issue PCNs to those who are parking Incorrectly without the appropriate permit. A CCTV van regularly monitors Longfield Avenue and will issue PCNs to parents who stop in the middle of the road, park on double/single yellow lines, park across the pavement or stop on the zig-zag lines to drop off/collect children. It is also important that you do not block the school car park to drop off/collect children. Doing this means that you are blocking the pavement causing a risk to pedestrians who then need to go into the road to pass your vehicle.

Following complaints from our neighbours, please can we ask that you be respectful of the environment and refrain from throwing rubbish from your cars onto the road/pavement. Please take your rubbish home or use a bin if there is one.
