Book Fair:

There will be a Book Fair from Thursday 3rd March 2022 to Wednesday 9th March 2022 from 3:10pm until 3.30pm in the school playground, weather permitting. There is always a great selection of books. For each book that gets sold, the school earns commission to buy books for the school library. This year, due to time and space we are asking different key stages to attend on different days. Please see the following:

- Thursday 3rd and Friday 4th March - Early years and Key Stage 1 children to attend
- Monday 7th and Tuesday 8th March - Key stage 2 to attend
- Wednesday 9th March - anyone who was unable to visit on the allocated dates can attend on this day

World Book Day: World Book Day is on Thursday 3rd March and children are asked to dress up as their favourite book character on that day. Year 4 has PPA in the afternoon so they can come to school in their costume but please remember to bring in their PE kits to change into.

Longfield Avenue: A reminder that you should only park in Longfield Avenue if you have the correct permit to do so. This road has resident permit bays and Waltham Forest will issue PCNs to those who are parking Incorrectly without the appropriate permit. A CCTV van regularly monitors Longfield Avenue and will issue PCNs to parents who stop in the middle of the road, park on double/single yellow lines, park across the pavement or stop on the zig-zag lines to drop off/collect children. It is also important that you do not block the school car park to drop off/collect children. Doing this means that you are blocking the pavement causing a risk to pedestrians who then need to go into the road to pass your vehicle.

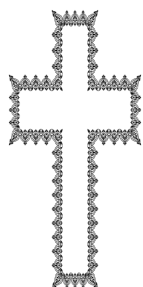
